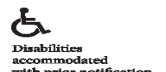

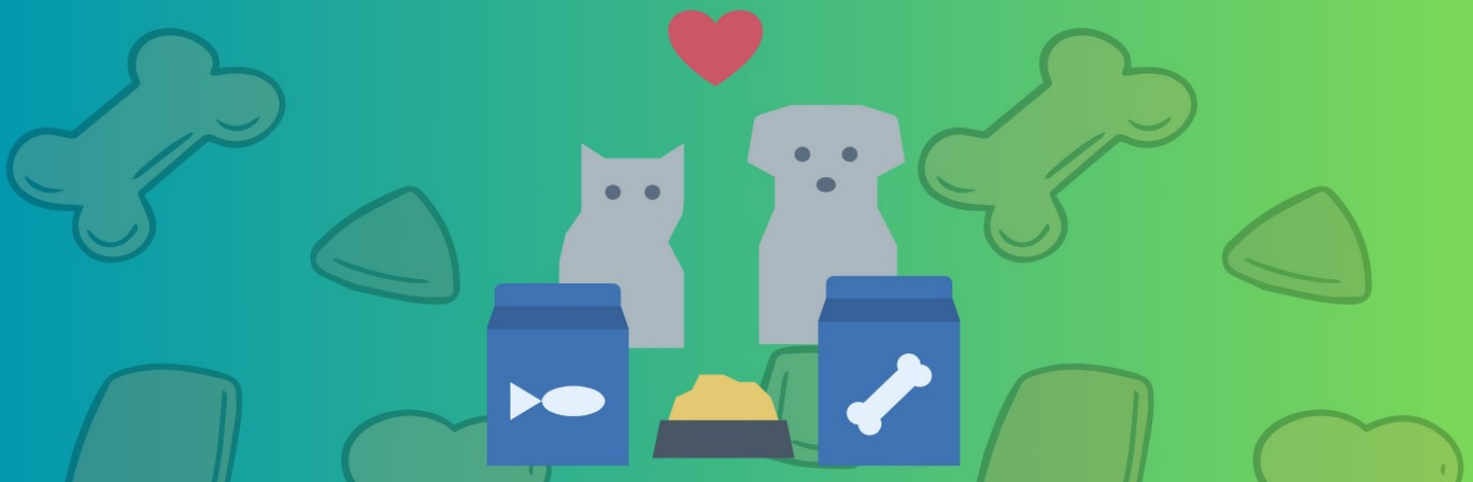


GRAYSON COUNTY 4-H DOG CLUB WITH GRAYSON COUNTY HOMEMAKERS ASSOCIATION

4-H RECIPE

SNICKERDOODLES

Yield: 3 dozen Cookies

Ingredients

- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1 cup butter or margarine, softened
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 eggs
- 2 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons cream of tartar
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon



Directions

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F.
2. In large bowl, cream together sugar, butter, vanilla, and eggs.
3. Add flour, cream of tartar, baking soda, and salt to creamed mixture; blend well.
4. Combine 2 tablespoons sugar and 2 teaspoons of cinnamon in a small bowl.
5. Shape dough into 1-inch balls.
6. Roll balls in sugar mixture.
7. Place balls 2 inches apart on ungreased cookie sheet.
8. Bake for 8-10 minutes or until cookies spring back when lightly touched with the fingers.
9. Use a spatula or turner to remove the hot cookies from the sheet. Place them on a rack to cool. When cool, store cookies in a container with a tight lid.

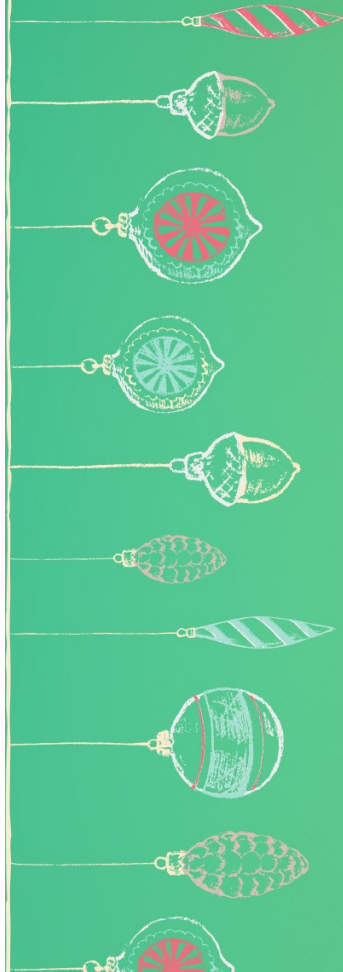
